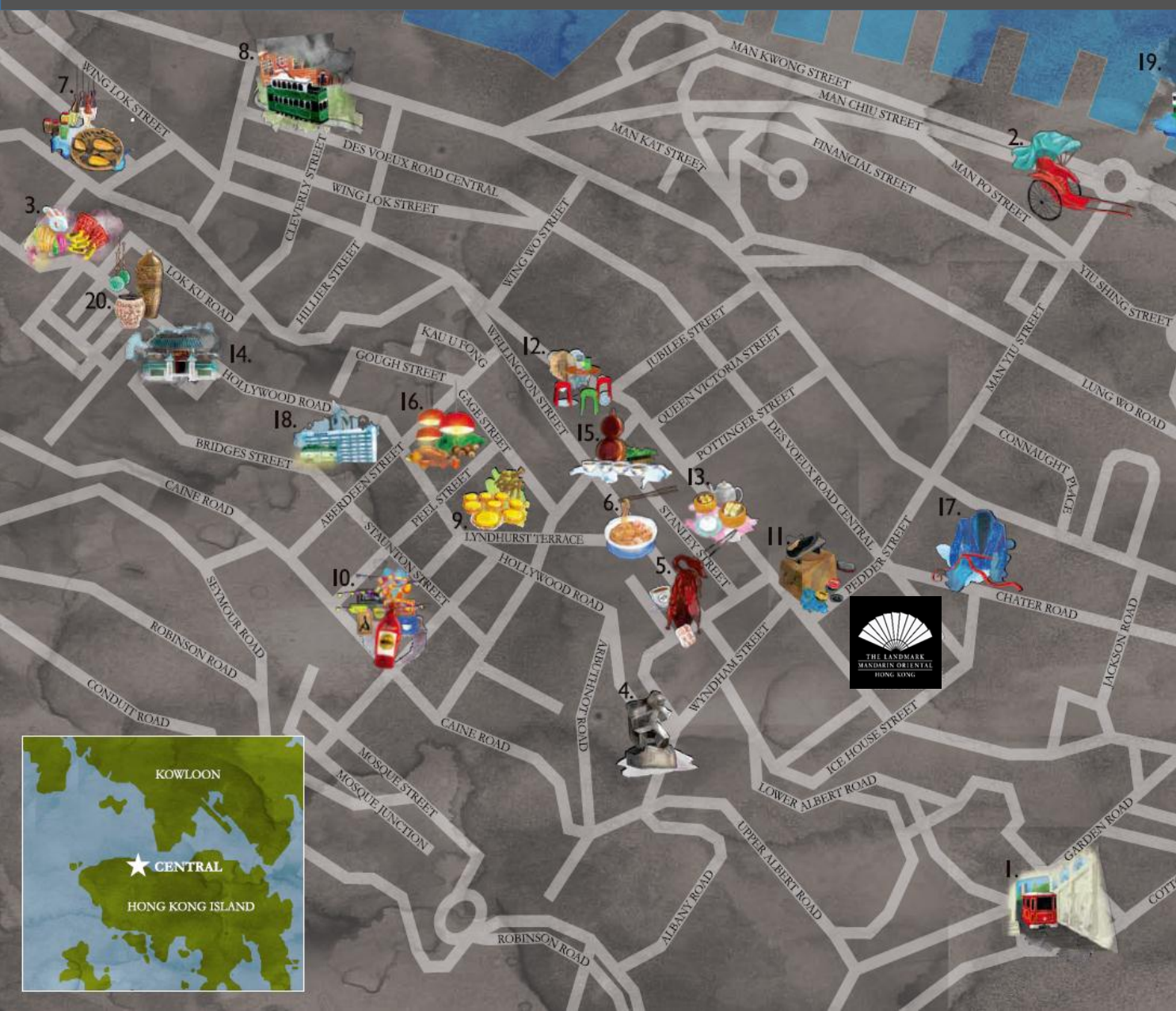

1. PEAK TRAM

Top of everyone's must-do list is a visit to The Peak, Hong Kong Island's highest point and one of the most exclusive neighbourhoods since colonial times. Back then it was the cooler air that attracted the rich and famous; nowadays it is the views of one of the world's most spectacular cityscapes that keep them coming.



2. RICKSHAW

The 'rickshaw' originated in Japan where it is known as jinrikisha. Its basic design includes a carriage resting on two large-diameter wheels, a pair of long parallel poles joined by a crossbar, in addition to a removable hood that is lowered or raised to protect the passenger against the burning sun or rain.

3. PAPER CRAFT SHOP

Traditionally, Chinese have decorated their houses with colourful flowers, fruit, lanterns and scrolls displaying messages of good wishes and fortune. Bright red, orange and gold are the most popular colours.



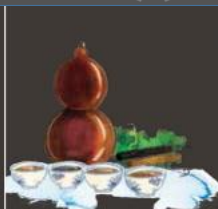
5. ROASTED GOOSE

The Americans chose the turkey. The Chinese opted for the duck. For Hong Kongers, their bird of choice for the dining table is always a perfectly roasted goose. After indulging in its crispy skin and tender, juicy flesh we think you'll agree local is best...



9. EGG TART

The classic snack may look simple, but it requires precise baking techniques and accuracy in the quantity of ingredients to create the perfect egg tart. This spot is renowned for its perfect mouthwatering marriage of flaky pastry and creamy filling.



15. CHINESE HERBAL TEA

Chinese herbal teas are a potent yet natural way to achieve good health and wellbeing. Do as the local Cantonese do and use as a highly effective way of relieving heat and humidity in the body.



12. DAI PAI DONG

Dai Pai Dong literally means 'restaurant with a big licence plate', referring to the size of the government licence that is bigger than Hong Kong's other licensed street vendors. These open-air food stalls are where locals enjoy inexpensive delicious local fare including congee, rice and noodles.



16. WET MARKET

Looking for an authentic Hong Kong experience? Head to a 'wet market' where you'll find the freshest meat and fish on display under traditional red lantern-like lamps. Bring your wellies; frequent and exuberant floor washing is what gives these markets their name.



17. ASCOT CHANG TAILOR

Hong Kong is famously known for its exceptional tailors who whip up a bespoke suit at a reasonable price tag. Ascot Chang Tailor is the standard bearer of custom tailoring delivering the luxury of a perfect fit.

4. CONTEMPORARY ART GALLERY

Is Hong Kong Asia's art capital? We think so, and so do a plethora of prestigious international and local art galleries showcasing some of the region's most provocative and entertaining art and design.



6. WONTON NOODLES

Whether you prefer them big and meaty or small and dainty, there's a wonton for everyone in this noodle capital: the Hong Kong version typically features dumplings comprising several shrimp held together by a delicate flour wrapper and served with chewy egg noodles in a savoury broth.



7. DRIED SEAFOOD

Dried seafood is a common ingredient in Chinese cooking and traditional tonics. The area was once dominated by salted fish stores, when workers would dry their products on rooftops, sell them on the ground floors and live on the floors in-between. Businesses have since expanded their sales pitch to include more high-end and auspicious options, including the Chinese banquet favourite, abalone.

10. SOHO DINING

The narrow streets south of Hollywood Road (SoHo) are home to an eclectic multicultural selection of up-market cocktail bars and exotic restaurants with something for everyone from craft beers to colonial-inspired Caribbean-French bistro fare.



13. LUK YU TEA HOUSE

This elegant, old-world teahouse with its wooden chairs and classic Chinese paintings is a step back in time but its authentic and delicious dim sum experience is timeless.



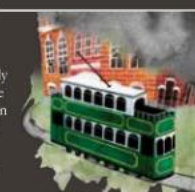
18. PMQ

Once the 'Police Married Quarters', this 1950s complex of colonial buildings is now one of Hong Kong's most creative design hubs. Go for quirky fashion by local designers, gourmet coffee, chic jewellery and everything else in-between.



11. SHOE SHINE SERVICE

There's no excuse not to sport gleaming shoes in Hong Kong, especially with Theatre Lane's pavement-side shoe polishers who wield their shoe cream and bristle brush with expert ease.



8. TRAMS

Hong Kong's trams, affectionately known locally as 'ding-ding', have been rumbling along the northern side of Hong Kong Island since 1904 and still provide a unique opportunity to experience Hong Kong's frenetic street life.

14. Man Mo Temple

A picturesque tribute to the God of Literature (Man) and the God of War (Mo), both of whom were worshipped by ambitious students looking to succeed in the civil examinations of Imperial China. Built in 1847, the Grade 1 historic building is also the place to see giant hanging incense coils.



19. STAR FERRY

There may be faster ways to cross the harbour but for millions of local and international travellers the Star Ferry is more than just a means of transport thanks to its iconic double-deck design that offers one of the best views of the Hong Kong skyline.



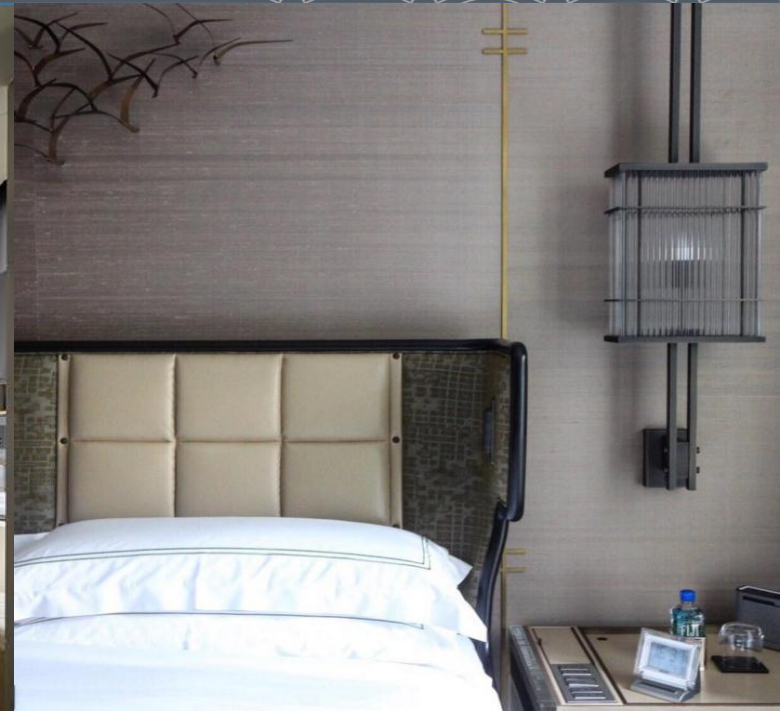
20. ANTIQUES

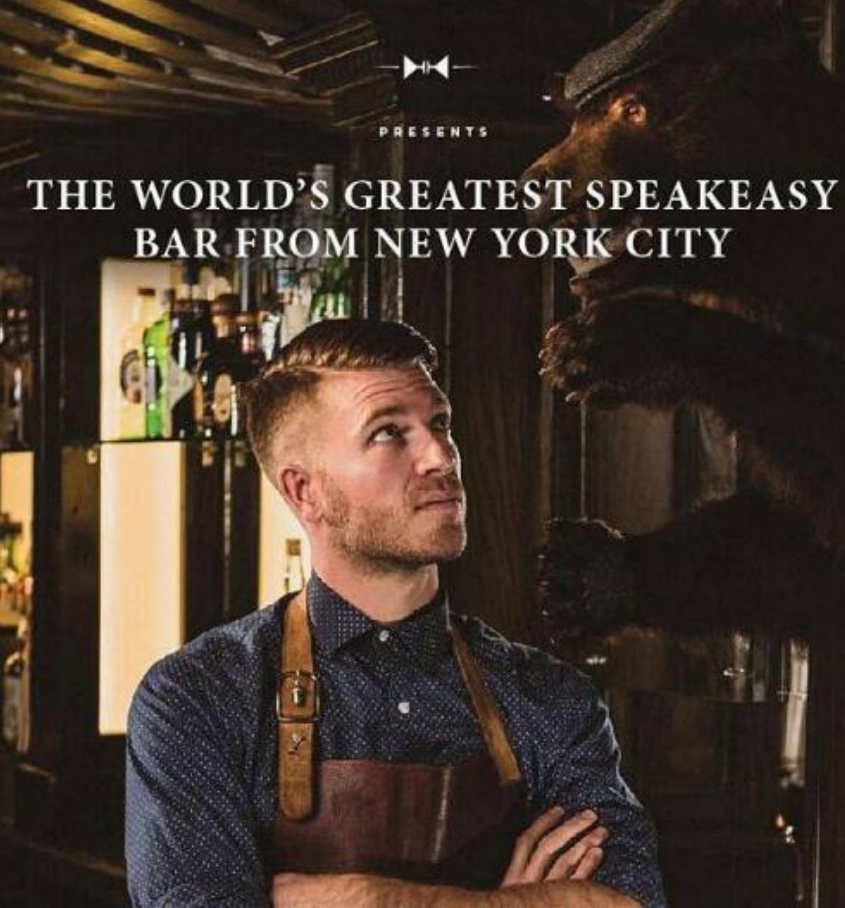
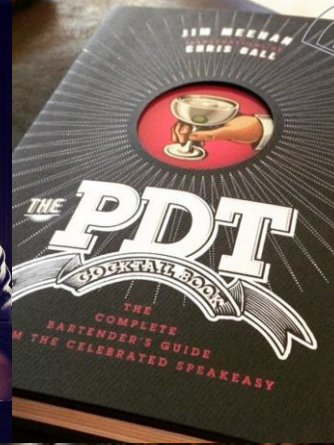
